'No entry in Pakistan, without authentic COVID-19 negative test'

Minister for Aviation Ghulam Sarwar Khan Tuesday said that entry within Pakistan territorial limits would not be allowed without the authentic COVID-19 through RT-PCR negative test result

Addressing a press conference after cabinet meeting along with Special Assistant to the Prime Minister on Information and Broadcasting Dr Firdous Ashiq Awan and Minister for Religious "all passengers travelling to Pakistan would be required to provide certified copy of test result for COVID-19 authorities" he added. He said that the

24 hour period prior to boarding the

He said, that the test result must include the name and passport number of the passenger. Original test result would be required at the disembarkation airport in Pakistan. All airlines were required to comply with this mandatory requirement, he added.

The condition would remain in place till April, 4, he added. He said, "This measure is being taken to control the spread of Corona virus in Pakistan."

Ghulam Sarwar Khan said, the requirement for test result would be in addition to current requirement of submission of completed health declaration form at the point of disembarkation in Pakistan. He said that the position would be continuously monitored as per the evolving situation and would be subject to review at appropriate time. He said that all domestic departures at the airports were required for the screening of the passengers for the Corona virus before being allowed to board the flight.

"This mandatory screening at domesfects from March, 21 with the help of respective federal or provincial health sary steps were in place to control the spread of Corona virus in the country. The international flight operation will

revert to the original airports, except Gwadar and Turbat and the international operation will remain suspended on wadar and Turbat airports, he added.

He said that earlier the international flight operations were shifted to three major airports i.e. Islamabad, Karachi and Lahore. The past few days have been spent in

HYDERABAD: The Deputy Commissioner Hyderabad, Ayesha Abro on Tuesday asked the traders, whole sellers and shop keepers to ensure sale of surgical masks, sanitizers, other protective material and daily use items at the rates already fixed by the administration.

The Deputy Commissioner chaired a meeting of the traders to ensure provision of surgical material, edible items and other necessary things on prescribed

The objective of this meeting is to warn those who were involved in black marketing of daily use items, Ms. Abro said and directed traders to ensure availability of surgical masks, edible items and other things on fixed prices.

The DC said 'she had directed concerned officers to conduct surprise raids

prices of the mentioned items, adding that in case of black marketing of these things action would be initiated against the vio-

The district administration has received several complaints regarding hike in prices of surgical masks, edible items and other things which is a gross violation of law. DC said and warned that during raid if anyone found involved in this dirty practice, heavy fines would be imposed against them and shops would also be sealed forthwith.

The Deputy Commissioner advised the traders to cooperate with the administration and refrain from over charging prices of above mentioned commodities.
