

Need for rejuvenating spirit of September 6, 1965 stressed

ISLAMABAD: Defence Analyst, Lieutenant General (Retd) Amjad Shoaib has underlined the need for rejuvenating the spirit of September 6, 1965 among the nation to thwart existing threats, emanating from across the eastern and western borders.

"6th September has great significance in our history as it was the day when our armed forces fought against a force which was quantitatively much bigger than Pakistan army, and we were able to successfully defend our country," he said.

Talking to APP, he said, "Their [India] Chief of Army Staff had claimed [at that time] that his force will get to Lahore immediately and early in the morning, he will be able to go to Lahore Gym-Khana and had his breakfast there. This was the dream he could not fulfill."

The analyst said Pakistan army quickly moved from the cantonment areas and defended the motherland as soon it learned that India had launched an attack on Pakistan without declaring a war.

"At that time people of Lahore, Sialkot and of those areas which

were closer to the international border came forward and helped in loading and unloading ammunition in army trucks." Amjad said it was a unique sort of unity demonstrated by the nation, adding, "This is the lesson we want to remember while celebrating 6th September that without unity and support of nation, no army can win any war." He said this lesson should be conveyed to people of Pakistan on the defence day as the country still, even today, needed similar spirit and unity amongst the nation and support for the armed forces to thwart the dangers, faced by the country on the eastern and western borders.

The analyst said another lesson which needed to be learned on the defence day was that the army should be very well trained, have faith in their cause and enjoy complete support of the nation.

"There is need to understand that every penny, which is being spent on army, is not wasted," he said.

He added that country's enemies had been using social media and other tools to create hatred and misunderstanding between people of Pakistan and the armed forces. "These are the things which we need

World powers asked to play role for resolving Kashmir issue

MIRPUR: Global Pak-Kashmir Supreme Council Chairman Raja Sikandar Khan has said that Kashmiri people were offering supreme sacrifices for the sake of freedom of the motherland from illegal Indian occupation and to secure their legitimate right to self-determination for over past 73 years.

He called upon all of the world powers including the United States, United Nations and the OIC to sincerely and seriously play their due global responsibilities in resolving Kashmir, the long-standing issue of the South Asia.

"The series of sacrifices were continuing from generation to generation of the valiant people of the Jammu & Kashmir", he said while addressing various public representative delegations and the media in London head office of his organization, said a press message reaching to the media here Tuesday afternoon.

Raja Sikander Khan observed that India, in fact, wanted to divert the world's attention from the fast-deteriorating situation in Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu & Kashmir by exercising repeated unlawful acts including mass-phased killing and victimization of the freedom-monger innocent IIOJK population victimization.

8,664 persons lodge in IIOJK jails in 2019

An official report released by the Indian government has revealed that 8664 persons were lodged in jails of Indian illegally occupied Jammu and Kashmir during 2019.

According to Kashmir Media Service, the report, Prison Statistics of India, 2019 – unveiled by the Indian National Crime Record Bureau (NCRB) lays bare that 8664 persons were admitted in jails of Kashmir Valley and Jammu region during last year.

The National Crime Record Bureau comes under administrative control of the Indian Ministry of Home Affairs.

According to the data, as on 31 December 2019, 3689 inmates were lodged in IIOJK jails against the overall capacity of 2910.

This means overall occupancy rate in jails of IIOJK was 126.8 percent, which shows overcrowding in the prisons.

As per the report, 12.5 percent inmates in IIOJK jails were detained at the end of 2019.

In India, the Tamil Nadu has (38.5 percent) and Gujarat (12.5 %) detainees.

Post abrogation of Article 370, the BJP-led Modi government had detained thousands of Hurriyat, political, social and civil society members and youth under the black law, Public Safety Act, which allows detention for a up to two years without trial. Some were detained in various jails of IIOJK while thousands others

ISLAMABAD: Universities across the country were developing policies and procedures in expectation of a governmental decision to reopen campuses from September 15 and in the light of guidance provided by Higher Education Commission (HEC).

It was disclosed in the 31st Vice Chancellors committee meeting held online attended by over 150 Vice Chancellors and Rectors across the country. The meeting considered various options on related issues, including staggering of courses, hybrid classes, class attendance, opening of hostels, management of transport services, health monitoring on campus, and SOPs for student safety.

Chairman HEC Tariq Banuri advised the university heads to announce their policy well in time, in a clear and unambiguous manner, and share it proactively with faculty members and students.

A number of Vice Chancellors, including UVAS, KEMU, Sucker IBA, KFUEIT, KIU, FJWU, PIFD, SBBWU, informed the meeting about the actions they had already taken in accordance with the HEC

guidelines. Others urged that VCs should be given flexibility in choosing the model that best suits the conditions on their campuses. Chairman HEC expressed appreciation for the actions already taken.

He also assured the participants that the HEC policies are based on a recognition of the diversity of conditions, saying: "You are the captains of your ships, and we have full confidence in you. We hope that under your leadership, our universities will ensure both the safety of students and faculty and the effective delivery of educational content."

Trump visits Kenosha, not to urge racial healing but to back police

KENOSHA, Wisconsin: US President Donald Trump defied requests to stay away and visited Kenosha, Wisconsin, not to urge racial healing after a white officer shot a black man in the back but to express support for law enforcement in a city rocked by civil unrest.

With the United States polarised over issues of racial injustice and police use of force, Trump is appealing to his base of white supporters with a "law and order" message as opinion polls show him cutting into the lead of his Democratic rival, former vice president Joe Biden.

Meanwhile Trump has largely overlooked the racial wounds caused by police use of force and played down the more than 180,000 US deaths from the coronavirus pandemic.

The Republican president also threatened to send more federal officers into cities governed by Democratic mayors even if local officials objected, saying, "At some point ... we'll just have to do it ourselves."

Trump did not visit Jacob Blake, who was paralysed from the waist down after a white police officer fired at his back seven times on Aug 23. He did not meet Blake's family either, but did meet with his mother's pastors.

The president visited a burned-out furniture store that was destroyed in the upheaval and then a makeshift command centre to praise National Guard troops who were called in to reinforce local police after several nights of peaceful protests gave way to looting, arson and gunfire.

"These are not acts of peaceful protest, but really domestic terror," Trump told local business leaders in a high school gym. —AFP

Saudi allows overflights by UAE services to 'all countries'

RIYADHI: Saudi Arabia has agreed to allow UAE flights to "all countries" to overfly the kingdom, state media reported days after allowing an Israeli aircraft to pass over en route to Abu Dhabi.

Saudi Arabia has accepted an Emirati request to allow "crossing the kingdom's airspace for flights heading to the UAE and departing from it to all countries", the official Saudi Press Agency said, citing a source from the civil aviation authority.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu meanwhile announced that Monday's historic first commercial flight of an Israeli aircraft direct to the United Arab Emirates across Saudi Arabia would not be the last.

"Israeli planes and those from all countries will be able to fly directly from Israel to Abu Dhabi and Dubai, and back," Netanyahu said, without giving any timeline.

The announcements come after a US-Israeli delega-



tion visited Abu Dhabi on Monday, on the first direct commercial flight from Tel Aviv to mark the normalisation of ties between the Jewish state and the UAE.

Saudi Arabia has said it will not follow the United Arab Emirates in establishing diplomatic ties with Israel until the Jewish state has signed an internationally recognised peace accord with the Palestinians. —AFP

Russia steps up support for Belarus' Lukashenko

MOSCOW: Russia issued strong support for beleaguered Belarusian President Alexander Lukashenko following weeks of opposition protests, stepping up official contacts and vowing to defend the ex-Soviet neighbours' alliance.

Moscow has recognised as legitimate disputed elections in which the Belarusian strongman claimed a sixth term, while opposition challenger Svetlana Tikhanovskaya has declared herself the true winner. Now the two governments have announced high-level political and military meetings in the coming days.

Prime Minister Mikhail Mishustin will arrive in Minsk on Thursday. He will be the most senior Russian official to make a public visit since the political crisis broke out over disputed presidential polls on August 9, with economic aid likely to top the agenda. —AFP
