

Traffic advisory issued ahead of Pakistan Day Parade on 23rd

ISLAMABAD: Islamabad Traffic Police (ITP) on Friday issued a traffic advisory for convenience of road users ahead of the Pakistan Day Parade on March 23.

According to ITP traffic plan, heavy traffic will not be allowed to enter Islamabad on March 21 and 23 from 12 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Light vehicles coming from Lahore will use route of Rawat T-Cross to reach motorway after passing through Rawalpindi Saddar Road and Peshawar GT Road.

Traffic coming from Airport Rawalpindi will use Expressway and to be diverted from Khanna Bridge. They may use Lehrtar Road, Captain Nacem Tufail Shaheed Chowk (Taramri Chowk), Park Road, Rawal Dam Chowk, Murree Road to reach G sectors or Kashmir Highway. Those motorists traveling for Murree may take turn from Kashmir Chowk and Bhara Kahu.

Those going to Islamabad Airport or Lahore will use 9th Avenue, Mur-

ree Road, Rawal Road and take right turn from Koral Flyover. The motorists coming from motorway may use Kashmir Highway to move towards Aabpara, Bhara Kaku and Murree. Faizabad will remain completely closed for all types of traffic while Expressway will also be closed from Khanna Bridge to Faizabad for light transport vehicles.

Likewise, Faisal Avenue will be closed from Zero Point to Faizabad and Murree Road to remain close from Rawal Dam Chowk to Faizabad on these days.

Only those people will be allowed to move on these roads having permission cards with them. Invitation cards in different colors have been issued to guests coming to attend the Parade which also guides route, parking lot and sitting area.

For instance those having invitation card of red color will reach sitting area after using the red marked route and parking vehicle in the red color parking area. Every guest will use the route according to the color

of his/her card.

Those guests coming from Rawalpindi, Jhelum and Mangla via Islamabad Expressway will use Shakarparian Flyover to enter the route number 1 parking area.

Those coming from Peshawar GT Road, Motorway via Kashmir highway will enter into their parking area after taking right from Dhokri Chowk to Murree Road than Rawl Dam Chowk to Numaish Road.

All the security and squad vehicles will be parked in black parking area established on Numaish Road.

Likewise, those coming from Islamabad will reach the parking area via Kashmir Highway, Zero Point Expressway and Garden Flyover while those coming from Rawalpindi via Murree Road and IIP Road will reach the parking lot through Garden Flyover after crossing Faizabad Flyover. Those coming from Lahore GT Road and Rawalpindi Koral Chowk via Expressway will use Garden Flyover to reach the parking area. —APP

Solving Balochistan's problems will bring end to Indian meddling: Mustafa Kamal

QUETTA: Pak Sarzameen Party (PSP) chief Mustafa Kamal has said that India sends agents like Kulbhushan Yadav to Balochistan because it is more deprived. If these deprivations are addressed, India will not be able to conspire against Pakistan.

Mustafa Kamal was addressing a rally in Quetta, saying that the people of Balochistan feel deprived and dejected. Every party comes and makes promises but the situation is getting worse with each passing day, he added.

He said that Balochistan's people elect the guardians of their rights and send them to the assemblies, but these elected representatives change their allegiances overnight. The vulnerable people are helpless in front of these landlords and waderas, even earning a living is difficult.

The PSP chief said that the state should talk directly to the public instead of only engaging the 2% privileged class. "Deliver the right to rule directly to the people", he said.

The only way to give people rights is to strengthen local governments, roads, education, hospitals and colleges should be owned by a local person, he added.

Mustafa Kamal promised that the Pak Sarzameen Party would deliver this power to every street, mountain

and neighborhood and solve all the problems of Balochistan.

Special team constituted for inspection of waste management companies

Punjab government has decided to stop the way of corruption into the waste management companies permanently and has constituted a special inspection team in this regard.

According to a letter issued by Local Government & Community Development Department, the special inspection team will carry out inspection of waste management companies including Multan, Bahawalpur, Gujranwala, Sialkot, Rawalpindi and Faisalabad.

The team will make scrutiny of funds provided to companies and audit financial statement.

The process of workers hired through third party and payment to contractors will also be checked.

The complete scrutiny of procurement process of machinery and other items and procurements which had made in past would be made.

The physical verification of machinery and worker's attendance will also be ensured and monitoring mechanism will be checked to stop improper use of vehicles and machinery.

The team will also make visit to landfill sites regarding environmental pollution and organizational structure of the company will also be checked.

Muhammad Ali remembered on his 15th death anniversary

ISLAMABAD: Lollywood legend and one of Pakistani cinema's greatest heroes 'Muhammad Ali' was paid glowing tributes on the occasion of his 15th death anniversary on Friday (today).

The actor who was known for his versatility played remarkable characters in more than 200 movies. His ability to deliver dialogues with emotional facial expressions earned him the title of Shahenshah-E-Jazbaat- The Emperor of Emotions.

Muhammad Ali was born to Maulana Syed Murshid Ali, an eminent religious scholar of his time in Rampur, India and after Partition, his family migrated to Pakistan and settled in Hyderabad, Sindh.

He started his career from Radio Pakistan as a broadcaster in 1956. It was 1962 when he made his debut in

the film industry with the movie Chirag Jalta Raha that became a hit and Ali played the villainous role in that movie, electronic channels reported.

"The era of Mohammad Ali was the golden period of Lollywood. He was amongst the people who did a lot for the local film industry.

He was talented and known for his solid acting. For others, Ali was a source of guidance. He worked with big actors and actresses of his time and never let anyone down.

He worked with leading stars of his time including Madam Noor Jehan, Shamim Ara, Sultan Rahi and Waheed Murad. Not to forget, he was also married to one of the most renowned heroines of the time, Zeba. And, together they were one of Lollywood's most sought-after

couples. He lived in Karachi for a few years and soon shifted to Lahore, claiming he saw a bright future for his work in the Walled City. "Mohammad Ali was a beautiful personality. Every heroine wished to work with him. He shifted to Lahore because it was the hub of film-making at the time. He was a noble man who helped everyone around him. For this reason, Mohammad Ali's name still makes the film industry proud," stated actor Durdana Rahman. A 10-time Nigar award winner, Ali was also presented the Pride of Performance Award in 1984. "Mohammad Ali did a lot of charity work for the welfare of the artist community. He established the Ali Zaib foundation while he was at the peak of his career and always supported poor actors. —APP

US says China actions 'threaten' global stability at states meeting

ANCHORAGE, Alaska: China's actions "threaten the rules-based order that maintains global stability", US Secretary of State Antony Blinken said at the open-

ing of a two-day meeting with Chinese counterparts in Alaska.

The US side will "discuss our deep concerns with actions by China, including Xinjiang", where Washington has accused Beijing of "genocide" against Uyghur Muslims, Blinken said at the Anchorage summit with the Chinese Communist Party's top diplomacy official, Yang Jiechi, and Foreign Minister Wang Yi.

He added that there would be dialogue on "Hong Kong, Taiwan, cyber attacks on the United States, economic coercion toward our allies". President Joe Biden's national security adviser Jake Sullivan added that the United States did not want conflict with China but welcomed tough competition with its strategic rival. "And we will always stand up for our principles for our people, and for our friends," Sullivan warned. Yang responded



with a 15-minute speech in Chinese while the US side awaited translation, lashing out about what he said was the United States' struggling democracy and poor treatment of minorities. He threatened "firm actions" against "US interference" and called for an end to the "Cold War mentality" stunting the rivals' relationship.

"China is firmly opposed to US interference in China's internal affairs. We have expressed our staunch opposition to such interference, and we will take firm actions in response. "What we need to do is to abandon the Cold War mentality, and

the zero-sum game approach," he said.

Yang added: "The United States uses its military force and financial hegemony to carry out long-arm jurisdiction and suppress other countries. "It abuses so-called notions of national security to obstruct normal trade exchanges, and incite some countries to attack China."

Apparently taken aback by Yang's remarks, Blinken held journalists in the room so he could respond.

Sullivan said the United States did not seek conflict with China, but would stand up for principles and friends. —AFP

100m US vaccines target will be met this week, says Biden



WASHINGTON: President Joe Biden said that his goal of getting 100 million coronavirus vaccine doses administered in his first 100 days in office will be met by Friday, far in advance of the original target.

"I'm proud to announce that tomorrow, 58 days into my administration, we will have met my goal of administering 100 million shots to our fellow Americans," he said in a White House speech.

When Biden came into office on Jan 20, the program to stop the coronavirus pandemic through national vaccination was

only just getting going.

Biden initially said he wanted 100 million doses administered within 100 days but after easily reaching that target he said he would announce a new benchmark next week. "Eight weeks ago, only eight percent of seniors - those most vulnerable to COVID-19 - had received a vaccination. Today, 65 per cent of people aged 65 or older have received at least one shot," he said. "That's key, because this is the population that represents 80 per cent of the well over 500,000 Covid-19 deaths that have occurred in America." —AFP

Successful test for NASA's giant moon rocket

WASHINGTON: NASA successfully carried out a key static test of its troubled Space Launch System (SLS) rocket a win for the agency as it prepares to return to the moon.

The second "hot fire" test saw all four of the rocket's RS-25 engines fire simultaneously at 4:40pm Eastern time (4.40am, Singapore time) for the full duration of eight minutes, producing a maximum of 1.6 million pounds of thrust (7.1 million newtons).

"The applause says a lot about how the team feels,"

Bill Wrobel, an official in charge of the test, said during a livestream after the control room began clapping.

"Looks pretty good right now," he added.

"This is a major milestone towards advancing our goals objectives for Artemis," acting NASA Administrator Steve Jurczyk later told reporters, referring to the lunar programme. NASA plans to place the first woman on the moon by 2024 and build a lunar orbital station, before eventually embarking on a crewed mission to Mars. The test's



success came as a relief to the agency after an earlier run involving the 65m high core stage at the Stennis Space Center near Bay St. Louis, Mississippi was cut short in January. "We've had some challenges," said Tom Whitmeyer, NASA's deputy associate adminis-

trator of exploration system development. "I'm just so proud of the team with the way they've methodically worked through these challenges." —AFP

In a first, US pipeline agency weighs climate change impacts



WASHINGTON: For the first time, a federal energy board is weighing how a proposed natural gas pipeline would affect greenhouse gas emissions, one of several steps taken this week by the Biden administration in its effort to slow climate change.

With a new Democratic chair at the helm, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission voted 3-2 to approve a pipeline operator's request to replace 140km of natural gas pipelines in South Dakota and Nebraska, finding that the project's climate-warming carbon emissions would not be significant. The ruling marked the first time the commission has formally assessed a pipeline's greenhouse gas emissions and their expected contribution to climate change, a reversal of policies pursued under Republican chairs appointed by former President Donald Trump.

FERC is an independent agency that regulates interstate transmission of electricity, natural gas and oil, among other tasks. Members are appointed by the president and confirmed by the Senate. "A proposed pipeline's contribution to #ClimateChange is 1 of its most consequential environmental impacts," the chair, Democrat Rich Glick, tweeted Thursday.

FERC "cannot claim to have adequately addressed the public interest without addressing the significance of that impact", Glick added. "More work to do, but this is an important start." Glick was one of two Democrats to support the addition of climate change as a key consideration, along with former FERC Chair Neil Chatterjee, a Republican who previously opposed the climate provision. Two other Republicans opposed the ruling. —AFP
