## Ban on bathing in Lahore canal being flouted

**LAHORE:** The ban on bathing in Lahore canal is being flouted as a great rush of youngsters was observed in the canal to beat the heat. Revellers were also observed making fun at the canal road which may cause any untoward incident. The enormous rush of people may also become an easy target for coronavirus.

Since the onset of COVID-19, the district administration has been taking effective measures to restrict bathing in canal, and this year also, the administration launched a crackdown to stop citizens, especially youngsters from taking bath in the city canal as it causes

multiple problems including serious accidents. Canal bathing increases especially in the current season because of extreme weather and the people have a lot of craze to take bath in canal water. Hundreds of canal goers gather at Muslim Town, Shah Di Khui, Johar Town, Garden Town, Thokar U-Turn, Mughalpur, Tajpura, Dharampura, Jallo and other points of the canal. Well placed sources in the local administration told APP here Saturday that canal bathing causes multiple problems because the overcrowding leads to traffic jams and serious accidents on the canal road.

There is a complete ban on taking bath or swimming in the city canal, and 'we have constituted special teams to check canal bathing especially in June, July and August. He mentioned that Deputy Commissioner Lahore had directed the district officer and assistant commissioners concerned to visit the canal frequently to ensure enforcement of the government restriction.

Meanwhile, a spokesperson for the City Traffic Police (CTP) told this scribe that traffic wardens had been directed not to let the people park their vehicles including auto rickshaws and motorbikes along sides the canal road, and do not spare the violators and issue them traffic challan. He added that drive against wrong parking would be intensified in consultation with the district administration and irrigation department. Dr Khalid Hussain, a Senior Professor at Services Hospital Lahore, told this scribe that bathing in canal water was fraught with numerous health hazards due to several contamination, adding that people taking bath in the canal may suffer from various diseases especially skin related issues.

## Coronavirus claims nine more lives, 415 new cases in Punjab

**LAHORE:** The coronavirus claimed nine more lives and 415 new cases were reported in Punjab during the last 24 hours.

According to data shared by a spokesperson for the Punjab Primary and Secondary Healthcare Department (PP&SHD) here on Saturday, death toll reached 10,874 and a total number of cases were recorded 349,890 while 329,478 patients had been recovered so far.

As per data provided by the PP&SHD, currently 9,547 patients are under treatment in different hospitals and 134 ones had been recovered. The health department conducted 17,684 tests for the COVID-19 and total 5.93 million tests had been conducted so far.

Meanwhile, 352,612 citizens had been vaccinated in 662 centres and a total number of vaccinated people reached 11,948,015 in the province.

## All main rivers continue to run normal

**LAHORE:** The Federal Flood Commission (FFC) on Saturday said that all main rivers (Indus, Jhelum, Chenab, Ravi and Sutlej) were flowing normal with no riverine flood situation in the country.

According to daily FFC report, the combined live storage capacity of Tarbela, Mangla & Chashma reservoirs is 4.183 MAF which is 30.95% of the total Combined Live Storage Capacity of 13.516 MAF.

Yesterday's trough of Strong Westerly Wave over Northern parts of Iran has moved Eastwards and lies over Northern parts of Afghanistan whereas weak Seasonal Low lies over Northern Balochistan.

Mild moist current from Arabian Sea is penetrating into upper parts of Pakistan upto 5000 feet which is very likely to become strong from Sunday. Yesterday's upper air circulation over Southern parts of Mumbai (India) has become insignificant.

For the ensuing 24 hours, isolated thunderstorm/rain has been predicted by FFD, Lahore, over Punjab (D.G. Khan Division), Sindh and

Balochistan including upper catchments of all the main rivers.

No significant rainfall events during the past 24 hours has been reported by FFD, Lahore except for Padidan=32 mm, Shaheed Benazirabad=16 mm and Turbat=12 mm.

According to FFD, Lahore, fairly widespread thunderstorm/rain with heavy falls at scattered places, very heavy falls at isolated places and extremely heavy falls at one or two places are expected over upper catchments of rivers Indus, Kabul, Jhelum and Chenab including Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Northern & Northeastern Punjab from Monday to Wednesday. Scattered thunderstorm/rain may also occur over upper catchments of Rivers Ravi, Sutlej and Beas during the same period.

As a result, Medium to High Flood is expected in rivers Indus, Kabul including their tributaries/nullahs and Hill Torrents of D.G. Khan Division, besides, High to Very High Flood in river Jhelum (upstream Mangla reservoir) and river Chenab including its tributaries (local nullahs) from Tuesday.
