

Coordinated collective progress on initiatives needed to combat global climate challenges: Mrs Sadia Rashid

KARACHI: Our challenge is to make coordinated and collective progress on the initiatives to combat global climate challenges and to take advantage of the synergies when we see them.

These views were expressed by Mrs. Sadia Rashid – President Hamdard Foundation Pakistan (HFP) while addressing at the 30th International Children's Health Conference (Online) organized via 'Zoom' platform by HFP in collaboration with Hamdard Public School (HPS) on 7th April to celebrate World Health Day 2022. Mrs. Sadia Rashid attended the conference from Hamdard Corporate Head Office.

Syed Sardar Ali Shah, Provincial Minister for Education and Literacy (Sindh) was

invited as a chief guest. In a welcome address, Mrs. Sadia Rashid said: "Shaheed Hakim Mohammed Said, a visionary reformer and founder of HFP, three decades ago, held a very unusual conference in the country which was aimed at creating awareness about health and healthy lifestyle among the children of the country. Since then every year, HFP organizes this important event to raise awareness about health among children."

While highlighting this year's theme of World Health Day "Our Planet, Our Health", she said: "This year's theme underlines the deep connection as to how closely our health



is bound to that of our planet. Pollution of air, water, and food adversely affects us. Everyone has to play their part in order to resolve these global challenges. At this crucial moment in our planet's evolution, no excuse is admissible to refuse to recognize our responsibility in reducing pollution."

She advised young participants to join the drive to plant more trees; and discourage the cutting down of them. "Do not join the crowd who have forgotten handkerchiefs, dusters, and towels, and only use tissues and paper towels, because it's a bad habit. Use recycled materials; neither use nor encourage the use of plastic in the form of polythene bags or plastic bottles. Take your own cloth-bags when you go shopping, and store stuff in reusable glass bottles and containers," she added.

Fatema Munir Ahmed, MD and CEO Hamdard Laboratories (Waqf) Pakistan, shared the messages of Dr. Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus—Director General, World Health Organization (WHO) and Dr. Palitha Mahipala, Head of Mission Country, WHO Representative Pakistan. In their video messages, they both applauded the efforts of HFP, especially Mrs. Sadia Rashid, for taking a proactive role in promoting the health sector not only in Pakistan but on an international level by becoming a part of global

awareness campaigns. Dr. Ahmed Al Mandaha, Regional Director WHO, Eastern Mediterranean Region, also sent his message of appreciation.

Police fire tear gas to disperse protest in Indonesia

JAKARTA: Indonesian police fired tear gas and water cannon on Monday to disperse hundreds of university students protesting high cooking oil prices and a mooted extension of President Joko Widodo's stay in office.

Crowds of demonstrators were seen running away from the scene outside parliament in the capital Jakarta, according to a witness, while Kompas TV said rocks had been thrown into the complex.

The rally was one of several across Indonesia on Monday, including in South Sulawesi, West Java and Jakarta, where hundreds of students wearing neon jackets had marched towards parliament to complain about rising goods costs and the prospect of the president outstaying his two-term limit.

Jakarta police chief Fadil Imran told a news conference that a university lecturer who was participating in the demonstration sustained "grave" injuries after a "non-student" group battered and stomped on him. Six police officers who tried to help the lecturer were also injured, he added. He did not say why the group had targeted the lecturer.

Jokowi, as the president is known, on Sunday sought to dampen speculation of a plan being hatched by his allies to keep him in power longer.

The idea of an extending his tenure either by changing the constitution or delaying the 2024 election, has gained momentum lately in the world's third-largest democracy after some influential political figures publicly backed it.

"What's clear is how the elites are forcing themselves to delay the election, and that's what hurts the constitution," said Muhammad Lutfi, a student attending the protest.

University students have traditionally been at the forefront of efforts to protect Indonesia's democratic gains, after taking to the streets in 1998 during huge protests that helped topple former strongman President Suharto. The idea of allowing more than the maximum two, five-year terms as president has fuelled concern about a threat to hard-won democratic reforms. —Reuters

Anti-Muslim clashes prompt Indian police to ban gatherings in affected areas

AHMEDABAD: Clashes between Hindus and Muslims during a religious festival prompted police in India to impose a curfew in one town and ban gatherings of more than four people in affected parts of Gujarat and two other states on Monday. A day earlier, at least one person was killed and ten, including nine police, were injured when a Hindu procession was pelted with stones in a town in the western state of Gujarat.

In the central state of Madhya Pradesh, more than 35 people were injured during similar clashes, while the eastern state of Jharkhand also suffered communal violence.

"We have detained seven people after the clashes and tight security arrangements have been put in place to prevent further tension," said M J

Chaudhari, a police official based in Khambat town of Gujarat's Anand district, where one incident took place. Authorities in Gujarat, Prime Minister Narendra Modi's home state, also imposed a curfew in parts of Himmatnagar town.

In 2002, Gujarat was gripped by deadly, large scale communal violence for around a month. Rights groups say about 2,000 people, mostly Muslims, were killed. Modi was the chief minister of Gujarat at that time and a rising star in the Hindu nationalist Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP). The festival on Sunday marked the birth of the Hindu Lord Ram, a physical incarnation of the god Vishnu. Last week police imposed a curfew in the desert state of Rajasthan after a similar attack on a religious procession. —Reuters

Shanghai to ease lockdown in some areas despite rise in Covid infections

SHANGHAI: Authorities in China's financial centre of Shanghai will start easing lockdown in some areas from Monday, despite reporting a record of more than 25,000 new COVID-19 infections, as they strive to get the city moving again after more than two weeks.

Shanghai has classed residential units into three risk categories, to allow those in areas with no positive cases during a two-week stretch to engage in "appropriate activity" in their neighbourhoods, city official Gu Honghui said. "Each district will announce the specific names of the first batch (of communities) divided into the three types, and three subsequent lists will

be announced in a timely manner," he told a news briefing. That promises relief for some of the city's 25 million residents, many of whom struggled to find food and medicine after more than three weeks locked down in the battle on China's biggest outbreak since

coronavirus was first discovered in central Wuhan in late 2019. One of the first districts to release its list was southwestern Jinshan, which posted the names of residential areas still in the high- and medium-risk categories in its official channel on messaging app Weibo.

Gu said Shanghai had divided the city into 7,624 areas that are still sealed off, a group of 2,460 now subject to "controls" after a week of no new infections, and 7,565 "prevention areas" that will be opened up after two weeks without a positive case. —AFP



Drugs out, surgeries cancelled as Sri Lanka's health system buckles

One of the first districts to release its list

was southwestern Jinshan, which posted the names of residential areas still in the high- and medium-risk categories in its official channel on messaging app Weibo.

Gu said Shanghai had divided the city into 7,624 areas that are still sealed off, a group of 2,460 now subject to "controls" after a week of no new infections, and 7,565 "prevention areas" that will be opened up after two weeks without a positive case. Those living in "prevention areas", though able to move around their neighbourhoods, must observe social distancing and could find themselves sealed off again if there are new infections, he said. —
