15 dead, 1,648 injured in 1,496 road traffic crashes in Punjab

LAHORE: The Punjab Emergency Service Department responded to 1496 Road Traffic Crashes (RTCs) in all 37 districts of Punjab during the last 24 hours. In these RTCs 15 people died, whereas 1648 were injured. Out of this 1060 people were seriously injured who were shifted to different hospitals. Whereas, 588 minor injured victims were treated at the incident site by Rescue Medical Teams thus reducing the burden of Hospitals. The majority (77%) involved Motorbikes, therefore effective enforcement of traffic laws and lane discipline are essential to reduce this increasing the number of Road Traffic Crashes. Further, the analysis showed that 719 drivers, 39 underage drivers, 170 pedestrians, and 774 passengers were among the victims of these road traffic crashes. The statistics show that 274 RTCs were reported in Lahore which affected 311 persons placing the Provincial Capital at top of the list followed by 115 Faisalabad in with 123 victims and at third Gujranwala with 106 RTCs and 93 victims. The details further reveal that 1663 victims were affected by road traffic crashes including 1258 males & 405 females, while the age group of the victims shows that 380 were under 18 years of age, 813 were between 18 and 40 years and rest of the 470 victims were reported above 40 years of age.

According to the data 1137 motorbikes, 117 auto-rickshaws, 180 motorcars, 32 vans, 11 passenger buses, 08 trucks and 148 other types of auto vehicles and slow-moving carts were involved in aforesaid road traffic accidents.

LAHORE: Pakistan and Spain shared the spoils in a two-match Test series as the hosts denied a win to the visitors by outsmarting them in the second clash at Barcelona on Wednesday.

According to the details made available here by Pakistan Hockey

Federation (PHF), Spain, who conceded defeat in the first game, levelled the series with a 5-3 win in the second game. The opening fixture played on Tuesday finished 4-1 to Pakistan. In the opening game, Muhammad Rizwan scored the first goal for Pakistan in the first quarter of the game through a short corner, while Mubashir netted the second

goal. Ijaz Ali scored the third field goal for Pakistan. At the end of the first half, Pakistan took a three-goal lead over Spain. In the fourth quarter of the second half, Pakistan's Roman scored the fourth goal. Spain scored one goal at the end of regulation time. In the first half of the second game, which was also the last match of Pakistan hockey team's Europe tour, Spain had a three goal lead over zero. In the second half of the game, Mubashir and Rizwan scored one goal apiece for Pakistan with the help of short corners. While Rana Waheed scored a scintillating field goal. The Spanish team scored two more goals.
