

PFA recovers 3,300 litres unhygienic bever-

MULTAN: Punjab Food Authority (PFA) on Tuesday foiled an attempt of supplying 3,300 litres of unhygienic beverages in the city and suburban areas during a raid at a juice factory situated near Bahawalpur road.

The PFA team, under the supervision of Director Operations South Punjab Muhammad Saif, raided the factory and recovered thousands of litres of unhygienic beverages from the factory. The beverages were going to be supplied in the city and the suburban areas. The officials disposed off the beverages and registered an FIR against the owner. The PFA officials said that the factory was being run without a license from the authorities concerned, and the beverages were being manufactured using sub-standard ingredients.

DC seeks applications for approval of animal hides collection: Deputy Commissioner (DC) Muhammad Tahir Watto sought applications till June 28 from individuals and organizations for getting approval to collect

hides of sacrificial animals. According to the notification issued by deputy commissioner office here on Tuesday, the applications submitted after the deadline will not be entertained and that the collection of hides by an organization or person without prior approval will be treated as an offence and will be dealt in accordance with the law. The interested applicants have been directed to attach copies of the national identity card, stamp paper and a copy of the approval letter issued by the Deputy Commissioner office in the last year 2021 for the collection of hides. The DC Muhammad Tahir Watto said that banned outfits would not be allowed to collect animal hides otherwise strict action would be taken against them.

Society equally responsible for thalassemia patients' care: The Women University Multan on Tuesday held a seminar and screening camp to create awareness on thalassemia and extend support to the kids living with the disease. The seminar was organized under auspices of Department of Biochemistry and Biotechnol-

ogy in collaboration with Punjab Thalassemia Prevention Project.

Addressing the seminar, Chief Executive Officer Health Syed Muhammad Ali Mehdi said that it was a collective responsibility of society to look after the kids suffering from thalassemia. Both, the government and community should work together to provide effective and sustainable access to medical care for the thalassemia patients. Vice Chancellor of the university Dr Uzma Qureshi also stressed the need to engage all sections of society including media, scholars, politicians, NGOs and others to sensitize the people on the issue.

Chairperson of the department Dr Maryum Zain and Dr Ahmed Nadeem gave a brief introduction about the genetic disease, while Dr Aslam Shiekh explained its symptoms and treatment procedure.

Dr Shahida Parveen also spoke and highlighted the importance of screening tests for the couples who intend to start a matrimonial life. A good number of students attended the seminar.

26 more dead in India monsoon fury, waters recede in Bangladesh



GUWAHATI, India: At least 26 more people have died in monsoon flooding and lightning strikes in India, as millions remained marooned in the country and neighbouring Bangladesh, authorities said. Floods are a regular menace in India and Bangladesh, but experts say climate change is increasing their frequency, fe-

licity and unpredictability for the two countries' 1.6 billion people. In India's northeastern state of Assam, three people were killed in landslides while six others died in flood waters, disaster management authorities said. In the eastern state of Bihar, lightning triggered by storms killed at least 17 people, according to

local disaster management minister Renu Devi. Assam continued to reel under severe flooding, with 5,140 villages across the state's 33 districts submerged by surging waters. More than 100,000 villagers are taking refuge in relief shelters. The state was first hit in April when pre-monsoon rains arrived, causing floods

that killed 44 people. The floodwaters receded after a few weeks, only to rise again in June at the start of the annual monsoon season and taking the state toll to 71 so far. In neighbouring Meghalaya state, at least 16 people have been killed since last Thursday after landslides and surging rivers that submerged roads. Monsoon storms have also unleashed devastating floods in Bangladesh that have left millions stranded and killed dozens so far. On Monday, flood water was gradually receding from the north-eastern district of Sylhet, though millions are still marooned, said Mosharrif Hossain, the chief administrator of the district. "The relief shelters are full of affected people. There's a huge crisis of food and drinking water. Many are scared to return home while many lost their houses in floodwater," he told AFP. But the receding water is flooding districts further downstream in Habiganj and Brahmanbaria, officials said. In Jamalpur district, an eight-year-old girl was swept away by strong currents from her inundated backyard and later found dead, police officer Aminul Islam said. Heavy rainfall also continued in the southeastern Chittagong Hills districts leading to waterlogging in the port city and exacerbating risks of landslides.

Hong Kong floating restaurant sinks in South China Sea

HONG KONG: Jumbo floating restaurant, a once famed but financially struggling Hong Kong tourist attraction, sank in the South China Sea after being towed away from the city, its parent company said.

It capsized on Sunday near the Parcel Islands after it "encountered adverse conditions" and began to take on water, Aberdeen Restaurant Enterprises announced in a statement. "The water depth at the scene is over 1,000 meters, making it extremely difficult to carry out salvage works," it added. The company said it was "very saddened by the incident" but that no crew members were injured. It said marine engineers had been hired to inspect the floating restaurant and install hoardings on the vessel before the trip, and that "all relevant approvals" had been obtained. The restaurant closed in March 2020, citing the Covid-19 pandemic as the final straw

after almost a decade of financial woes. Operator Melco International Development said last month the business had not been profitable since 2013 and cumulative losses had exceeded HK\$100 million (\$12.7 million).

It was still costing millions in maintenance fees every year and around a dozen businesses and organisations had declined an invitation to take it over at no charge, Melco added. It announced last month that ahead of its licence expiration in June, Jumbo would leave Hong Kong and await a new operator at an undisclosed location. The restaurant set off shortly before noon last Tuesday from the southern Hong Kong Island typhoon shelter where it had sat for nearly half a century. Opened in 1976 by the late casino tycoon Stanley Ho, in its glory days it embodied the height of luxury, reportedly costing more than HK\$30 million to build. —AFP

'No future for us,' say Afghan Sikhs

KABUL: A dozen Afghan Sikhs gathered on Monday in a room behind the charred ruins of their temple in Kabul, hoping to be swiftly evacuated having finally given up on the country of their birth. "There is no future for us here. I have lost all hope," said Ragbir Singh, who was wounded when gunmen stormed the temple

Saturday in an attack claimed by the Islamic State group. "Everywhere we are under threat." When the Taliban seized power in August, many Sikhs sought refuge at the complex, living communally or in family groups scattered around the building. The Sikh community had been a target before. In March

2020, at least 25 people were killed when gunmen stormed a different temple in Kabul. And in 2018 at least 19 people, most of them Sikhs, were killed by a suicide bombing in the eastern city of Jalalabad. Both attacks were claimed by IS, which regularly targets members of Afghanistan's minority communities -- including

Shias and Sufis. The number of Sikhs and Hindus living in Afghanistan had dwindled to around 200 by late last year, compared with about half a million in the 1970s. Most of those who remained were traders involved in selling herbal medicines and electronic goods brought from India and Pakistan. For Manmohan Singh Sethi. —AFP

Moscow fumes over EU blockade of Baltic outpost

KYIV: Russia summoned the European Union's ambassador in Moscow on Tuesday, fuming over a rail blockade that has halted shipments of many basic goods to a Russian outpost on the Baltic Sea, the latest stand-off over sanctions imposed over the war in Ukraine. On the ground in eastern Ukraine, Russia's separatist proxies said they were advancing towards Kyiv's main battlefield bastion. A Ukrainian official described a lull in fighting there as the "calm before the storm". The latest diplomatic crisis is over the Kaliningrad enclave, a port

and surrounding countryside on the Baltic Sea that is home to nearly a million Russians, connected to the rest of Russia by a rail link through EU- and NATO-member Lithuania. In recent days, Lithuania has shut the route for basic goods including construction materials, metals and coal. Vilnius and Brussels say Lithuania is implementing new EU sanctions that came into force on Saturday. Moscow calls the move an illegal blockade and has threatened unspecified retaliation. The EU ambassador in Moscow appeared at the Russian foreign ministry. —APP
