### Illegal sale points of sacrificial animals closed

**LAHORE:** The Metropolitan Corporation Lahore (MCL) on Tuesday closed 31 illegal sale points for sacrificial animals in the urban areas of the provincial capital. On special directives of the Commissioner Lahore Division Usman Younis, the MCL squads inspected different zones of the city and removed five sale points in Samnabad zone, three in Gulberg zone, four in Nishtar zone, three in Allama Iqbal zone, five in Shalamar zone, two in Wahga zone, three in Ravi zone and six in Aziz Bhatti zone. Moreover, central squad of the department also closed various sale points. The authorities impounded around 88 sacrificial animals, and shifting them to MCL yard.

### PFA discards 5,500-litre expired juice

**LAHORE:** The Punjab Food Authority (PFA) stopped production of two juice factories on Tuesday and lodged the first information reports (FIRs) against the food business operators besides discarding thousands of litres of expired beverages. PFA Director General Shoaib Khan Jadoon said that action was taken against both units during inspection of the juice factories on Sheikhpura Road. He said that the PFA discarded 5,500 litres of expired juices and 80kg of fungus-infested expired mango pulp during visit to the factories. He said that the PFA also found an abundance of insects and stinky environment on the premises.

## Governor Punjab assures to implement SDGs agenda

**LAHORE:** Special Assistant to Prime Minister on Political Affairs Romina Khurshid Alam called on Governor Punjab and sought help in the implementation of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in various sectors especially the higher education. The SAPM Romina Khurshid , who is also Convener of the National Parliamentary Task Force on SDGs, briefed the Governor on various initiative to fight climate change, urban flooding and waste management.

SAPM on Youth Affairs Shiza Fatima Khawaja was also present during the meeting. She said as convener of the Task Force, she was also working on peace building initiatives, renewal of energy and zero carbon emissions from the factories. She said she was working with the universities and other departments to make the programme a

success and many young university students were working as interns with her. The SAPM called upon the Governor Punjab to make SDGs part of the syllabus in the universities, adding that the schools administration should also

be tasked to ensure SDGs programme. Hailing her services as an active parliamentarian, Governor Punjab said he was making a consortium of the universities to create awareness on climate change among the youth, adding that

the climate change was a big challenge as it also affected the agriculture adversely. He said the syllabus of universities was designed by the Higher Education Commission (HEC) and Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) and implanted in the universities. 'I, as Chancellor of public sector universities and patron in chief of private sector universities, will try to help you disseminate your message', adding that SDGs have been made for the good of humanity and these should be taken along for the elimination of poverty from societies.

"There is always a sense of deprivation why SDGs have not been achieved in Pakistan despite the fact that most of the world has adopted the SDGs goals", he added. Balighur Rehman hailed the efforts to fight for zero urban flooding, missing components in the waste management and wastage of water in the country.

## IG directs Rawalpindi police to remain on high alert in wake of deluge in Nala Lai

**LAHORE:** Inspector General of Police (IGP), Punjab Rao Sardar Ali Khan has issued instructions to Rawalpindi police to remain on high alert in view of the threat of flood in Nala Lai due to continuous rains in Rawalpindi.

IG Punjab said that special teams should be formed to provide timely assistance to the citizens and protect their lives and property during the monsoon season and additional teams should also be kept ready for the protection of precious human lives in any emergency. Rao Sardar Ali Khan said that Rawalpindi police would provide all possible assistance to the district administration and rescue agencies in relief work and all possible steps would be taken to protect the property of the citizens. IG Punjab said that special arrangements should be made to keep the traffic flowing during rains.

He directed traffic police higher Ups to ensure smooth flow of traffic by conducting field visits instead of sitting in offices during rains. IG Punjab said that concrete steps should be taken for the security of Eid gatherings in all the districts of Rawalpindi region on the occasion of Eid-ul-Adha and all resources should be utilized for the security of such gatherings held in mosques, imambargahs and open spaces. Rao Sardar Ali Khan said that an effective system should be set up to maintain the flow of traffic on moon night and patrolling around the cattle markets. He directed that additional teams should be deployed on the highways for the protection of traders and passengers. IG Punjab ordered to carry out indiscriminate operation against the land grabbing mafia in



Rawalpindi. He called for immediate crackdown on prevention of street crime and organized gangs. He also stressed upon observing zero tolerance against incidents of violence and sexual harassment with women and children. He issued these instructions to RPO Rawalpindi, CPO Rawalpindi, DPOs of Attock, Jhelum and Chakwal at RPO office. Instructing the supervisory officers, IG Punjab said that Murree Tourism Police should be made more active, special measures should be taken to guide the tourists during the Eid holidays and maintain the flow of traffic.

IG Punjab directed that the Murree Tourism Police and the Traffic Police should work out a special plan for the convenience, assistance and protection of the citizens during the Eid holidays and long weekends. IG Punjab directed to deploy additional staff at the congested places. IG Punjab directed that intelligence-based operations be carried out in Rawalpindi, Attock, Chakwal and Jhelum to root out criminals and ensure that supervisory officers take steps under personal supervision to prevent serious crimes and bring the accused to justice.
