

Telenor, UNICEF partner to strengthen child online protection

ISLAMABAD: Telenor Pakistan and UNICEF have partnered to scale the Child Online Protection agenda in Pakistan through their joint digital initiative, 'Strengthening Child Online Protection for Children and Young People in Pakistan'. The program promotes safe and responsible internet usage among children, caregivers, and educators through awareness and capacity-building efforts. In addition to promoting safe internet usage, the program will support the government by developing localized policies and regulatory frameworks for the masses on child safety online said a news release on Thursday. In the next three years, Telenor Pakistan and UNICEF will train 750,000

children, caregivers, and educators through a hybrid training module. They also plan to engage with key stakeholders for creating a suitable legal and policy environment with an evidence-based, consultative, and coordinated approach toward children and young people's protection in the digital world. At the partnership signing ceremony, Kamal Ahmed, Chief Corporate Affairs Officer, Telenor Pakistan, said, "Increased access to digital platforms brings progress to the society but raises safety concerns for children. Digital skills and online safety is a collective responsibility. Through this partnership with UNICEF, Telenor Pakistan will continue promoting digital inclusion,

online safety, and new skillset to help young people navigate a connected world. Our ambition is to build the capacity and enable children, educators, and caregivers to adopt measures for online protection." The rapid digital acceleration in recent years has fundamentally sped up the course of technological innovation, bringing with it innumerable benefits and some undesirable risks. With one in three internet users today being children, there needs to be a clearer focus on the child protection landscape. More than 30% of young people in 30 countries reported being cyberbullied, with one in five even skipping school. tainability and Partnership, Telenor said, "Telenor Group's global partnership with UNICEF plays a key role in realizing our ambition of empowering societies by promoting digital inclusion, increasing connectivity, and building skills for a digital future for children and young people." Can put headscarf reform to vote, says Erdogan

ANKARA: Turkish President Tayyip Erdogan said on Wednesday his ruling AK Party (AKP) could put a constitutional amendment protecting women's right to wear headscarves to a referendum if it was not passed by parliament. The AKP was set to present the reform to parliament as soon as parties step up efforts to appeal to voters ahead of presidential and parliamentary elections set for June with polls showing dwindling support for Erdogan and the AKP. However, the secularist CHP revived the issue last month with a proposal to enshrine the right to wear headscarves as it reached out to devout Turks, having long opposed the wearing of headscarves in parliament and public offices. In response, Erdogan raised the stakes by proposing a constitutional reform on the issue encompassing measures to protect the family from what he called "perverse trends," appearing to take aim at global same-sex marriage laws. Ethiopia warring parties agree to cease hostilities



ADDIS ABABA: The warring sides in Ethiopia announced on Wednesday an agreement to silence their guns after two years of devastating conflict that have claimed thousands of lives and left millions needing aid in Africa's second most populous country. The surprise deal between Prime Minister Abiy Ahmed's government and Tigrayan rebels was unveiled after little over a week of negotiations led by the African Union in South Africa and was hailed by the UN and the US among others. "We have agreed to permanently silence the guns and end the two years of conflict in northern Ethiopia," the government and Tigray People's Lib-

eration Front (TPLF) said in a joint statement after marathon talks. The breakthrough was announced by the African Union's mediator, former Nigerian president Olusegun Obasanjo, almost exactly two years to the day since the war erupted in November 2020. "Today is the beginning of a new dawn for Ethiopia, for the Horn of Africa and indeed for Africa as a whole," he said. "The two parties in the Ethiopian conflict have formally agreed to the cessation of hostilities as well as the systematic, orderly, smooth and coordinated disarmament," Obasanjo said at a briefing in Pretoria. They also agreed on a "restoration of law and order, restoration

of services, unhindered access to humanitarian supplies, protection of civilians ... among other areas of agreement", he added. It was not immediately clear how the deal would be monitored to ensure it was implemented, and there was no mention by Obasanjo of international and rebel calls for Eritrea's feared army to withdraw from the battlefield. Diplomatic efforts to bring Abiy's government and the TPLF to the negotiating table had taken on renewed urgency after combat resumed in late August, torpedoing a five-month truce that had allowed limited amounts of aid into war-stricken Tigray. The talks were

launched on Tuesday last week and were initially scheduled to run until Sunday but were extended. They were the first formal dialogue between the two sides since the start of the conflict that had raised concerns about the stability of Ethiopia and the volatile Horn of Africa region. UN Secretary General Antonio Guterres hailed Obasanjo's announcement as "a welcome first step" that could "bring some solace" to millions of suffering civilians, his spokesman Stephane Dujarric told reporters. The United States also described it as an "important step towards peace", with State Department spokesman Ned Price hoping it would lead to a



this tragic period of conflict behind us". Tigrayan delegation chief Getachew Reda said they were ready to "implement and expedite this agreement", adding: "In order to address the pains of our people, we have made concessions because we have to build trust." The war has forced well over two million people from their homes, and according to US estimates killed as many as half a million. Despite the peace process in Pretoria, intense fighting had continued unabated in Tigray, where government troops backed by the Eritrean army and regional forces waged artillery bombardments and air strikes, capturing a string of towns from the rebels. The international community had voiced increasing alarm over the combat and the toll among civilians caught in the crossfire. Asked about Eritrea, South Africa's former vice president Phumzile Mlambo-Ngcuka, who was facilitating the negotiations, said only: "These two parties (Ethiopia's government and Tigrayan authorities) are not the only two groups that are relevant for peace. —AP

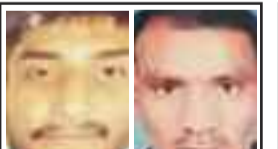
