

Bhara Kahu bypass project: Powers to change master plan rests with govt: IHC

ISLAMABAD: The Islamabad High Court (IHC) while hearing the Quaid-e-Azam University (QAU) professors petition against under construction Bhara Kahu by pass on the land of university has directed federal government to see the matter. The court observed Additional Attorney General (AAG) should hear all the stake holders till next Friday and inform the court about the matter. The court extended till next Friday stay order on Bhara Kahu bypass project to the extent of QAU land. The court remarked if some ambulance has to come from Bhara Kahu then difficulties are faced. The case came up for hearing before a

single bench of IHC led by Justice Miangul Hassan Aurangzeb Friday. The court remarked this by pass will take ten years time. Come here with such a solution which affects at least. Opportunity should be given to federal government to resolve the matter. We give one week time. AAG told the court this is public interest matter and we will proceed as per court's orders. The court remarked what temporary relief I have given it is burden on my mind. We should not stop on this project for long time. The court inquired what about master plan. Where is master plan. Tell us. The map was presented on this occasion under the order of the court.

The court observed map is not master plan. Show us master plan. Has any meeting been held among the faculty members or with CDA. The counsel for the petitioner told the court mention of Margalla road along with Margalla hills is made in master plan which is going side by side with Margalla hills. The court inquired is the land allocated for university in master plan. The counsel for the petitioner said yes it is. The land is allocated for educational purposes near national park. The court remarked the powers for bringing change in master plan rest with only federal government and no one else can change it. As per master plan the entire Bhara Kahu comprises encroachments. If CDA demol-

ishes it then the affectees will not be able to claim the compensation. CDA should interfere in this matter. University too is part of government. The counsel for CDA told the court Environment Department has seen lay out plan and has declared it better than the previous plan. The court remarked no one is demolishing the university nor the university is being closed. It has been assured that the educational process will not be affected. There should be sub meeting of cabinet and representatives of CDA and university be called therein. The reservations of all respondents should be allayed. Land be arranged for university on Murree road near the university.

10m ton shipped from Ukraine under grain deal



UNITED NATIONS: Ten million tonnes of grains and food-stuffs have left Ukraine in the past three months, the UN chief said on Thursday, calling for the renewal of a deal vital to "reducing the risk of hunger" worldwide. The landmark announcement comes just days after the Black Sea grain deal, which was put in place over the summer to ease the global food crisis caused by Russia's war in Ukraine, was called into question by Moscow's complaints over sanctions. "The Black Sea Grain Initiative is making a difference," United Nations chief Antonio Guterres told journalists. "As of today, ten million metric tonnes of grain and other food-stuffs have been shipped through the Black Sea corridor. It has taken just three months to reach this milestone." He noted that Russia's brief withdrawal from the deal earlier

this week, which led to a further increase in global food prices, had shown the "importance" of the accord in stemming the global food crisis and "reducing the risks of hunger, poverty, and instability". "The initiative is working. It is our collective responsibility to keep it working smoothly," said Guterres. He called for concentrated efforts toward the "renewal and full implementation of the Black Sea grain initiative". The 120-day grain deal was signed between Moscow, Kyiv, the UN, and Turkey on July 22 in an effort to combat the global food crisis sparked by the war, which had stalled all agricultural exports from one of the world's breadbaskets. Even before Russia's move to pull out of the deal on Saturday, from which it backtracked on Wednesday, uncertainty over the extension of the initiative had led to price in-

creases of certain products. Guterres also urged the parties to focus on "removing the remaining obstacles to the exports of Russian food and fertiliser". Russia has slammed its inability to export its own grain and fertiliser as part of a second agreement, due to Western sanctions. **RUSSIA SUSPENDS UKRAINE GRAIN EXPORT DEAL:** Russia has suspended participation in a UN-brokered deal to export agricultural produce from Ukrainian ports after attacks on ships in Crimea, Russia's defence ministry said on Saturday, dealing a blow to a three-month agreement aimed at easing a global squeeze on grain supplies. Russia said that Ukrainian forces, with the help of drones, attacked ships from the Black Sea Fleet in Sevastopol, the biggest city in Russian-annexed Crimea,

in the early hours of Saturday. "Taking into account... the terrorist act by the Kyiv regime with the participation of British experts against the ships of the Black Sea Fleet and civilian vessels involved in ensuring the security of the 'grain corridor', the Russian side suspends participation in the implementation of agreements on the export of agricultural products from Ukrainian ports," the ministry said in a statement. The ministry said earlier that the drone attacks on Saturday were largely repelled, with minor damage to a Russian minesweeper. The Ukrainian president's chief of staff, Andriy Yermak, accused Russia of "blackmail" and "invented terror attacks" on its own territory on Saturday, following explosions in the Crimea peninsula on Saturday. On Friday, UN Secretary General Antonio Guterres called on "all parties" to "make every effort" to extend the agreement on Ukrainian grain exports, including facilitating shipments of Russian grain, his spokesman said. The deal, signed in July by the UN, Ukraine, Russia and Turkey, allowed over nine million tonnes of Ukrainian grain to be exported. Russian Agriculture Minister Dmitry Patrushev on Saturday said Russia was ready to supply up to 500,000 tonnes of grain to poor countries in the next four months for free, with assistance from Turkey, and supplant supplies of Ukrainian grains. "Taking into account this year's harvest, the Russian Federation is fully prepared to replace Ukrainian grain and deliver supplies at affordable prices to all interested countries," he added. —AFP

'Hazardous' smog chokes New Delhi

NEW DELHI: Smog hit "hazardous" levels in New Delhi on Thursday as smoke from thousands of crop fires in northern India combined with other pollutants to create a noxious grey cocktail enveloping the megacity. Levels of the most dangerous particles — PM2.5, so tiny they can enter the bloodstream — were 588 per cubic metre early on Thursday morning, according to monitoring firm IQAir. That is almost 40 times the daily maximum recommended by the World Health Organisation. IQAir rated overall pollution levels as "hazardous". "This is really the worst time to be out in Delhi. One never wakes up fresh with this pollution," policeman Hem Raj, 42, said. "The body feels tired and lethargic in the morning... The eyes are always watery and throat scratchy after spending hours on Delhi's roads," he said. Every winter, cooler air, smoke from farmers burning stubble, and emissions from vehicles and other sources combine to create a deadly smog reducing visibility in the city of 20 million people. "It's killing us": Delhi's smog-choked roads take their toll. Stinging eyes, an unrelenting cough and chronic lung disease have taken their toll on Bhajan Lal, an auto rickshaw driver navigating the Indian capital's chaotic roads and poisonous air. For the last three decades, Lal carted passengers along bumpy thoroughfares to temples, markets and offices in New Delhi, working every day through the winter months when a pall of toxic smog settles over the sprawling megacity. "The pollution causes a lot of problems for my throat," the 58-year-old told AFP, after a morning spent in the driver's seat of his motorised three-wheeler. "My eyes sting... My lungs are affected, which creates breathing problems. —Agencies
