

Sarah Inam murder: Islamabad court orders Samina Shah's release on bail

ISLAMABAD: A district and sessions court in Islamabad on Wednesday granted bail to Samina Shah, the mother of prime suspect Shahnawaz Amir in the Sarah Inam murder case, against the surety of Rs1 million.

Sameena was arrested on October 19 by the Islamabad police for allegedly facilitating Shahnawaz in the murder. Her bail plea was rejected multiple times after she failed to prove allegations against herself in the murder case.

Shahnawaz allegedly killed his wife Sarah at home after a row over a family issue on September 23. Shahnawaz — who was detained by the police from a farmhouse in Islamabad's Chak Shahzad area for being a suspect in his wife's murder — confessed to committing the crime and said that he "thought" his spouse was having an affair with someone else. The couple was married for just



three months. In the police report registered following the murder, an additional clause of Section 109 (punishment for abetment) of the Pakistan Penal Code was added at the request of Sarah's uncles — Colonel (retd) Ikram and Zia-ur-Rahim — who have blamed Amir and his former wife for their niece's murder. The petitioners maintained that Sameena has been

living at the farmhouse where Sarah was murdered. At the outset of the hearing, Sameena's lawyer said that the suspect informed the police about the incident.

"The suspect cooperated with the police in the investigation and even reached the police station," he added. He said that the suspect did not commit any crime and the police did not find anything from her. At this, the petitioner's lawyer said that every citizen is responsible to inform the police of a crime as per the Constitution. "The suspect was present at the crime scene and was not the first one to inform the police," he remarked. He said that the suspect knew that the victim was present at the house as per the records. "The record shows that the victim was kept at home against her will," he said. Sameena's lawyer said that she cooperated in the investigation and did not cheat. —APP

FIA given powers to crackdown on social media hatemongers

ISLAMABAD: The Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) has been armed with powers to clamp down on social media disinformers, propagandists, hatemongers, and the runners of smear drives against the 'institutions' of the state and also to jail the guilty for up to seven years.

The agency was empowered through an amendment to the FIA Act, 1974, approved by the federal government a day earlier. Late last month, cabinet members passed a summary on circulation from the Ministry of Interior about the amendments in the schedule of the Act. As the cabinet couldn't meet because of Prime Minister's unavailability, the summary was given a go-ahead through circulation. According to the summary, FIA has intimated that presently, social media is inundated with false information and rumours against state institutions and organisations with the intent to cause or incite or which is likely to cause or incite

any officer, soldier, sailor or airman in the army, navy, or air force of Pakistan to mutiny, offence or otherwise disregard or fail in his duty as such. The summary further said these rumours and false information were also being disseminated with the intent to cause, or which is likely to cause, fear or alarm in the public or in any section of the public whereby any person may be induced to commit an offence against the state or against the public tranquillity. "FIA has added that these are likely to incite any class or community of persons to commit any offence against any other class or community," it said. The government was informed that the subject offence could be tried under Section 505 (statement conducing to public mischief) of the Pakistan Penal Code (PPC), which was currently not included in the schedule of the FIA Act and sought the state's approval to include the section in its scheduled offences. —APP

N Korean missile lands off S Korean coast for first time; South responds with own launches

SEOUL: A North Korean ballistic missile landed less than 60 kilometres off South Korea's coast on Wednesday, the first time an apparent test had landed near the South's waters, prompting South Korea to issue rare air raid warnings and launch missiles in protest.

The missile landed outside of South Korea's territorial waters, but south of the Northern Limit Line (NLL), a disputed inter-Korean maritime border in what South Korean President Yoon Suk-yeol called an "effective act of territorial encroachment." South Korean warplanes fired three air-to-ground missiles into the sea north across the NLL in response, the South's military said.

An official said the weapons used included an AGM-84H/K SLAM-ER, which is a US-made "stand-off" precision attack weapon that can fly for up to 270km with a 360 kilogrammes warhead. The South's launches came after Yoon's office vowed a "swift and firm response" so North Korea "pays the price for provocation". The North Korean weapon was one of three short-range ballistic missiles fired from the North Korean coastal area of Wonsan into the sea, South Korea's Joint Chiefs of Staff (JCS) said. The JCS later said as many as 10 missiles of various types had been fired from North Korea's east and west coasts. The JCS said at least one of the missiles landed 26km south of the NLL, 57km from the South Korean city of Sokcho, on the east coast, and 167km from the island of Ulleung, where air raid warnings were issued.

"We heard the siren at around 8:55am and all of us in the building went down to the evacuation place in the basement," an Ulleung county official

told Reuters. "We stayed there until we came upstairs at around 9:15am after hearing that the projectile fell into the high seas." A resident on the southern part of the island said they received no warnings. Nuclear-armed North Korea has tested a record number of missiles this year, and officials in Seoul and Washington say the North has completed technical preparations to conduct a nuclear weapon test for the first time since 2017.

The launches came just hours after Pyongyang demanded that the United States and South Korea stop large-scale military exercises, saying such "military rashness and provocation can be no longer tolerated." Despite Yoon's declaring a national week of mourning after more than 150 people were killed in a weekend crowd surge in Seoul, the United States and South Korea began one of

their largest combined military air drills on Monday. Dubbed Vigilant Storm, the exercises involve hundreds of warplanes from both sides staging mock attacks 24 hours a day. North Korea had said that a recent flurry of launches were in response to allied drills. Pak Jong Chon, secretary of the Central Committee of North Korea's ruling Workers' Party, said in a statement on Wednesday that the number of warplanes involved in Vigilant Storm proved the exercise was "aggressive and provocative" and specifically targeted North Korea. He said even its name imitated the US-led Operation Desert Storm against Iraq in the 1990s. "The hostile forces' inordinate moves for military confrontation have created a grave situation on the Korean peninsula," Pak said in a statement carried by state news agency KCNA. —AFP
